Religion and Culture in Contemporary Societies

Modern societies cannot be understood without analyzing the element of religion. This specialized master's degree qualifies students for the social scientific study of religions and their links to social and cultural contexts.

Content

Students acquire profound knowledge of religious traditions, social and religious studies theories, and methods. They develop essential competences on the topics of culture, religion, and society. The program co-operates with other disciplines, such as Sociology, Anthropology, and Gender Studies.

Modalities

Mono study program with 120 ECTS, in English or German. Non-consecutive study program: Prerequisite for admission is a BA degree in social or cultural sciences (equivalent to at least a minor study program). Individual admission is possible. Part-time: Flexible and individual study planning is supported.

Career Perspectives

Graduates are skilled in competences demanded in professional fields such as media, journalism and publishing, political consulting and diplomacy, international and intercultural organizations and NGOs, cultural management, congress and exhibition organization, tourism as well as politics and administration.
